12	HERE COMES THE PLAINTIFF, David A. Perry, Pro Se, who requests that this
13	Court compel its Clerk to make an entry of default, pursuant to the NC Rules of Civil Procedure,
14	
15	G.S. 1A-1, Rule 55(a), for the Defendant the New Hanover County Sheriff's Office. To that end
16	the Plaintiff swears to the following set of facts:
17	1. The Defendant, the New Hanover County Sheriff's Office, filed a Motion to Dismiss in
18	this matter on October 27, 2021. This motion was heard before Judge Harrell on
19	November 2, 2021. Counsel for the aforementioned Defendant appeared before this Cour
20	on that date, but their motion was denied.
21	
22	2. Pursuant to the NC Rules of Civil Procedure, G.S. 1A-1, Rule 12(a)(1)(a), the Defendant
23	had 20 days in which to serve the Plaintiff with an Answer in this case. This means that
24	the Defendant should have filed such a responsive pleading by the end of business on
25   26	November 22, 2021. They did not.
27	3. The Defendant, the New Hanover County Board of Education, did file a timely Motion

Hanover County Sheriff's Office, did not join in that motion, nor did they individually file any motion seeking a time extension.

- 4. As a result of the Defendant's inaction, the Plaintiff filed a Motion for Entry of Default on November 29, 2021 against the New Hanover County Sheriff's Office. It requested that the Clerk make an entry of default, pursuant to the NC Rules of Civil Procedure, G.S. 1A-1, Rule 55(a) for this Defendant.
- 5. On December 7, 2021 the Plaintiff went to Clerk's office to inquire as to whether the entry of default had been ordered. The Assistant Clerk informed the Plaintiff that it had not, and that the reason for this was because they had been told not to make an entry of default for defendants who had appeared before the Court.
- 6. Such inaction by the Clerk of this Court clearly violates NC Rules of Civil Procedure, G.S. 1A-1, Rule 55(a). The Clerk is required to make an entry of default when the record shows that a party has failed to timely submit a responsive pleading. It is well established in case law that submitting a motion to dismiss and making an appearance is not the equivalent to the timely submission of a responsive pleading.
- 7. It seems likely to the Plaintiff that whatever instructions that have been given to the Clerk's Office regarding entries of default, have conflated the requirements of Clerk Entered Default Judgement (pursuant to NC Rules of Civil Procedure, G.S. 1A-1, Rule 55(b)(1)) with the separate requirements of Clerk Entries of Default (pursuant to NC Rules of Civil Procedure, G.S. 1A-1, Rule 55(a)). The former requires a "failure to appear", while the latter only requires the lack of a timely submitted responsive pleading.
- 8. The Defendant, the New Hanover County Board of Education, timely submitted its answer on December 16, 2021. As of this date, the Defendant, the New Hanover County

Sheriff's Office, has yet to submit an answer or any type of recognized responsive pleading. If this motion is granted, the case is ready to proceed with the one remaining non-defaulted defendant.

THEREFORE, the Plaintiff humbly beseeches this Court to compel its Clerk to immediately make an entry of default for the defendant, the New Hanover County Sheriff's Office. Furthermore, it is requested that the Clerk's Office receive updated guidance on the proper handling of motions for entry of default.
