EXPEDITED MOTION FOR SPECIFIC FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

HERE COMES THE PLAINTIFF, who by virtue of G.S.-1A-1, Rule 52 of the North Carolina Rules of Civil Procedure, requests that this Court immediately issue a legal memorandum which details the specific findings of fact and conclusions of law behind its <u>Order</u> of March 22, 2022 (Timestamped 3/23/2022).

On March 21, 2022 a hearing was held for this Court to consider the Motion for Summary Judgement submitted by the defendant, the New Hanover County Board of Education. In addition, this Court also considered the cross motion for summary judgement that was submitted by the Plaintiff. Each party submitted a brief / legal memorandum to support their motions, conducted oral arguments, and Judge R. Kent Harrell stated that he would take the matter under advisement and that a decision would be likely by the end of the week.

On March 23, 2022 the Plaintiff received an email from the Trial Court Administrator, Tonya M. Gilley, and attached a copy of the aforementioned Court Order. The Order stated that "The Court having reviewed the joint stipulations of fact, the memoranda of

law and having heard the arguments of the parties finds that the defendant is entitle to judgement as a matter of law." No specific findings of fact, legal analysis, or conclusions of law were present in the Order. The Order goes on to grant the defendant's motion for summary judgement, deny the Plaintiff's cross motion for summary judgement, and dismiss the Plaintiff's claims.

The Order constitutes a final entry of judgement in the case. Therefore, pursuant to Article II, Rule 3 of the North Carolina Rules of Appellate Procedure, the Plaintiff only has 30 days from the date of the Order (3/23/2022) to: 1) Decide whether an appeal is justified; 2) Write the appeal; 3) Submit the appeal; and 4) Serve all parties in the case with a copy of such an appeal. Therefore, it is necessary for the Plaintiff to receive the Court's specific findings of fact and conclusions of law in order to make an informed decision on whether to appeal, and to have the pertinent information available to actually know what findings of fact or conclusions of law that the Plaintiff should include in such an appeal.

Furthermore, this case has garnered a substantial amount of public attention.

There is a large group of people in New Hanover County that believe that requiring masks at school board meetings violates their rights under the NC Open Meetings Law and the 1<sup>st</sup>

Amendment. The public deserves to know the reasoning behind the Court's decision to side with the Defendants in this case.

Finally, the Plaintiff requests that Judge Harrell grant this motion without a hearing. The Plaintiff leaves on the afternoon of 3/28/2022 for business in Poland and will not return to this country until at least 5/28/2022 at the earliest. While a possible appeal can be done through the mail, the Plaintiff will simply not be available to attend an in-person hearing on this matter.

THEREFORE, the Plaintiff requests that the honorable Judge R. Kent Harrell issue the requested legal memorandum as quickly as possible.
